Listed here are locations for the Camden County American Revolution Trail and corresponding Mobile App. Most of these locations will have interpretive signs and Mobile App stops in the next two years, as we prepare for the 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution in 2026.



This walking and driving tour will take you in the footsteps of American, British, and Hessian soldiers fighting during the Revolutionary War. This tour highlights the story of a young French man, the Marquis de Lafayette, whose bravery during this battle caused the Continental Congress to appoint him in command of 3,400 soldiers of the Continental Army. American Revolution Museum of South Jersey

The Camden County Historical Society is transforming Camden's most historic property, the Benjamin Cooper House, into the American Revolution Museum of Southern New Jersey in time for the America's 250th celebrations on July 4, 2026.

The restoration of the Benjamin Cooper House and its adaptive reuse as the American Revolution Museum of Southern New Jersey will benefit the State of New Jersey by attracting thousands of heritage tourism visitors, especially from Philadelphia during the years leading up to America's 250th celebration in 2026. The Museum will also be a visitor center, have nonprofit offices, and be a community center for the neighborhood.

The Camden County Historical Society is restoring this national treasure now and dedicated it to the overlooked American Revolution history of Southern New Jersey. The project will also examine the promise of the Declaration of Independence's statement that "All men are created equal," as later codified in the US Constitution's 14th Amendment (equal protection clause), and the struggle for equality to the present day. The Benjamin Cooper House is the Trailhead for the North Camden and Cramer Hill Waterfront Trails Project, which is part of the 33- mile bicycle and pedestrian Camden County Link Trail to Atlantic County. This project envisions the construction of trails connecting North Camden/Cramer Hill with the larger region. As trailhead, the Benjamin Cooper House is envisioned as a key hub and welcome center on this trail, providing a nice synergy with the proposed museum, visitor center, and community center uses.
